traditions vital for the spiritof nation building.


• To induce a sense of responsibility & ownership for the nation as a whole through these close cross-cultural interactions as it intends to build up theinter-dependence matrix unequivocally.


<u>Activities of the *Ek Bharat Shreshth*</u> <u>*Bharat*</u> (EBSB) Club during the session 2021-22

A one day educational trip was organised by department of history in collaboration with "Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat club" on May 14,2022 to the National Museum, New Delhi, which is also known as the National Museum of India. It is one of the largest museums in India. Established in 1949, it holds a variety of articles ranging from pre-historic era to modern works of art. It functions under the Ministry of Culture, Government of India. The collections of the National Museum represents almost all disciplines of art: archaeology (sculptures in stone, bronze and terracota), arms, armour, decorative arts, jewellery, manuscripts, miniatures and Tanjore paintings, textiles, numismatics, epigraphy, Central Asian antiquities, anthropology, Pre-Columbian American and Western Art Collections. The trip comprised total 45 students accompanied by faculty members Mrs. Anila Bathla, Dr. Neelam Rathee, Dr. Hardeep Singh and Dr. Raunak Rathee.
