Address by Keynote Speaker, Prof. Bhim Singh Dahiya :-. Professor Bhim Singh Dahiya began his lecture by quoting Greek Philosopher Plato who said that literature is mirror to society. Plato's pupil Aristotle said that literature is effected by History & Philosophy and can be known from the contemporary history of every age. Literary Trends keep changing and play an important role. Literature of a Nation vary from time to time. According to Bhim Singh Dahiya Anglo-American Writers writing in English have influence the Indian English Writer as well but the writing of Diasporic writers such as Arvind Adiga's The White Tiger, Jhumpa Lahiri's The Namesake, etc. are not as authentic experience compare to the wrtings of Indian English Writers.He also said that regional Literature records authentic and first hand experiences and argument quoting Kamble's The Prisons supported his by Baby WeBroke.



Mr. Sudershan Dhingra Ji said that Teacher is Nation Builder. There is a need of change in educational values especially work ethics. Literature is helpful in inculcating ethical values and sensitivity our society towards social problem.

Mr. Rajesh Kumar Sehgal Ji said that activities like seminar are very much helpful in growth of knowledge. He praised efforts of all the staff members'.

After inaugural session, there was a tea break. Thereafter there was plenary Session. Chairperson of plenary session was Prof. SPS Dahiya, Department of English and foreign Language, M. D. University, Rohtak and three speakers Prof. Jaibir Singh Hooda (Department of English & Foreign Language, M. D. University, Rohtak), Dr. Garima Gupta (Department of English Jammu University Jammu) and Prof. Jagdish Batra (OPJS University, Sonipat).

Dr. Garima Focused on "Notepad to wattpad: Trending creativity of 'Dig Indians' She said that present day generation is using wattpad for writing & reading literature. Wattpad is an online platform for reading and writing. 'Kavishala' is a personal blog that is a global publishing platform for poets and writers. Kavishala has published more than 25000 works and has more than 11000 Writters. Other online publishing platforms are like Pinterest, Twitter, Watt pad etc. Literature today is not only in Books & Magazines, Comic Books, Newspaper, but is in the form of Audiobooks, Facebook, Twitter (Micropoetry, Blogs, Instagram, Whatsapp, SMS poetry and on many other online platforms also. There is need of looking outside poetry to find poetry. Innovation poetry is outside the existing structure of the print industry.

Dr. Jagdish Batra said that there are various genres of novels like Romance, Thriller, Crime, Sports fiction, Eco criticism, Eco feminism and so on. Chetan Bhagat had brought modern revolution in field of Literature. He talked about the research in which he included 200 books

from different genres. He found out in this research that romance, thriller and popular literature topped the list. He also found out that the history based novels are evergreen and always in trend.
