



- The Controller of Examinations ensures quality, transparency, and confidentiality in the examination process.

- The college should enhance its internship and training programs for students to provide practical exposure and hands-on experience in their respective fields. By collaborating

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
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with industry partners and organizations, students can gain valuable skills, knowledge, and industry insights to prepare them for future careers.


