The built-in area encompasses three-storied and 2 two-storied buildings that comprise of well-furnished airy classrooms and administrative offices, seminar halls and labs. It leads to overburdening of existing faculty members, affecting their productivity and the overall learning experience of students. This shortfall impacts the student-teacher ratio and affects the quality of education and attention each student receives.

Another weakness of the college is the limited scope of research opportunities available to students and faculty members. This is primarily due to the limited number of postgraduate courses offered by the college as ours is basically an undergraduate college having only 3 post graduate courses at present. Without a diverse range of postgraduate courses, students and faculty members have limited options for pursuing research in their respective fields.

The non-flexible curriculum is another weakness of our college. As an affiliated college, the curriculum is determined by the affiliating university, leaving little room for the college to introduce new and innovative courses or make changes to the existing curriculum. This lack of flexibility restricts the college's ability to adapt to changing educational trends and meet the evolving needs of students and industries.

Limited financial resources are also a major weakness of the college. Without adequate funding, the college struggles to upgrade its infrastructure, modernize its facilities, and provide the necessary resources for academic and research activities. This impacts the overall quality of education and the college's ability to attract and retain talented faculty members and students.

In conclusion, we face several weaknesses that need to be addressed in order to enhance its overall academic standing and reputation. It's important for the college to seek innovative solutions and partnerships that can help overcome these challenges and continue to offer a valuable educational experience to its students.

The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

Sh. L. N. Hindu College is affiliated with MDU, Rohtak, Haryana, and adheres strictly to the curriculum and academic calendar prescribed by the University. All academic processes are streamlined according to the university calendar. At the beginning of each session, the workload committee prepares a centralized timetable based on allotted subjects to facilitate smooth curriculum completion, in accordance with the norms of the University and DGHE Haryana. The college adopts a Learning Outcomes-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) for all postgraduate courses under the Choice-Based Credit System and applies an Elective Subject Option system to all undergraduate courses as per the Maharshi Dayanand University curriculum. Faculty members prepare lesson plans, course outcomes, and program outcomes, including lectures, tutorials, and practicals. These lesson plans are periodically reviewed by a designated committee to ensure timely syllabus completion. An orientation session is conducted annually for new students to acquaint them with the various opportunities available at the college. Periodic meetings between the Principal and Heads of Departments are held to review all academic activities. The college follows a continuous internal evaluation process established by the parent university, which aids in assessing students' comprehensive capabilities. In addition to classroom teaching, students must submit two assignments and take one test. The schedule for assignment submission and class tests is prepared, notified, and circulated in advance as per the norms. Internet facilities are available for teachers and students to access the latest online learning resources. Various interactive pedagogical activities, such as group discussions, PowerPoint presentations, fieldwork, assignments, quizzes, and session tests, are employed to enhance the effectiveness and interest of curriculum learning. To keep students updated, teachers participate in faculty development programs, refresher courses, seminars, conferences, and workshops. Project work, fieldwork, educational tours, and industrial tours are organized for student exposure. 2.5.1

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

Our college is affiliated to M.D University, Rohtak, therefore, followe it's rules and guidelines related to the internal assessment and the process for evaluation of the overall performance of the students. M.D. University has a Continuous Internal Evaluation system in which each paper of 100 marks has a component of 20 marks of internal assessment and remaining 80 marks are allotted for the final theory paper. Internal Assessment is designed and bifurcated in such a way that a complete and continuous evaluation of the students will take place throughout the semester. To ensure transparency in the system, the bifurcation of the marks in internal assessment is informed to the students and the very start of the academic session. Academic Calendar is prepared under the supervision of Coordinator, IQAC. Students are informed about regular class tests and assignments to be submitted well in advance so that they can prepare themselves accordingly to improve their academic performances. Apart from this, Centralized Sessionals Tests are also conducted by the Academic Committee for better outcomes. These exams are quite transparent as all the evaluated answer sheets are shown to the students in the classrooms. It is a full proof transparent system/ mechanism to prepare the students for final exam without fail. Internal assessment is given on the basis of attendance, class tests, assignments, participation in various activities, hence, the performance based evaluation of the students is done to avoid any kind of discrepancy. This method of internal assessment is more transparent and helps the teachers to evaluate the students more appropriately according to their performance. The students have consistently bagged the University merit positions and won laurels for the institution. Our college considers evaluation as a benchmark for effective teaching-learning process. For the purpose, the college has a well organised and time-bound mechanism for the redressal of exams related grievances in the form of Internal Assessment Monitoring Committee, which aims to look into the complaints lodged by the students. As the college considers the complaints and feedback as an important part of the internal quality, therefore, evaluation process is carried out in the time-bound schedule and in the best possible efficient manner. The Continuous Evaluation system conducted with the help of students' overall performance, which further helps to carry

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out to the internal assessment in a well-planned and systematic manner. Any query/doubt of the students regarding the evaluation process is thoroughly entertained by the concerned authority which takes the necessary action to ensure the transparency in the system. If any student is not satisfied with the marks given to him/her, then he/she can put the issue before the committee and is thoroughly resolved immediately which enable this to fare batter in future. In this way, the entire mechanism to deal with the internal examinations related grievances is quite transparent as per the rules and regulations. Faculty and students are also made aware of the transparency to be maintained in the system which enhances rapport between the two.

Sh. Lal Nath Hindu College, Rohtak has acquired a remarkable position for the quality of its academic programs and well developed physical infrastructure and diverse variety of student and faculty amenities. There are 4 post-graduation programs and 9 bachelor's degree programs available to students at the college.

College Campus: The college is located at the outskirts of Rohtak City on Bhiwani Road. The huge campus has a total area of 13 acres covered in teaching blocks, beautiful lawns, auditorium and sports ground.

Teaching Blocks: There are four independent teaching blocks(A,B,C&D) at the college. The infrastructure of the College is differently-abled friendly with ramps facility.

Library: The college library is partially automated with KOHA Software since 2015 and contains over 40000 + books.

Classrooms: There are thirty six classrooms with adequate furniture and seating capacity, lights, fans and windows to allow natural light and ventilation. Green boards are available in all the classrooms. 13 classroom are updated with white ceramic boards by replacing green boards.

Laboratories: There are 13 laboratories (six for science department, three for computer science department, and one each for music, home science, and language studies). The laboratories are well-equipped for conducting practical experiments across various disciplines.

Auditorium: Beyond academics, the institution prioritizes the holistic development of students by providing ample facilities for cultural and sports activities. The college has an auditorium with acoustics system, with 550 seating capacities equipped with built in sound systems. The College has well equipped music lab to train the students. The institution organizes a variety of cultural events such as celebrating birth anniversaries, National and International days, festivals, art, music, dance events, Talent Search competition, book exhibitions, essay writing competitions, poster presentations, and food presentations etc.

These activities not only foster creativity but also promote cultural awareness and artistic expression among students. A well-equipped auditorium serves as a venue for various cultural events, extension lectures, seminars, and theatrical performances.

Seminar Halls: The College has two seminar halls with 100 seating capacity with projector, and LED Interactive panels.

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Sports Facilities & Yoga: The College has a playground of an area of approx. 174240 square feet for outdoor sports activities. The College has playgrounds for football, basketball, Volley ball, cricket pitch and 400 m athletic track, including javelin throw, discuss, shot puts etc. The college has a multipurpose hall which is used for indoor games like-chess, carom judo, and also used for taekwondo. A Trained Instructors is also appointed for assistance, guidance and training.

The institution recognizes the importance of physical fitness and mental well-being, offering facilities for yoga. The College celebrates International Yoga Day on June 21 st every year. Yoga Mats and ample space for performing yoga is also available in the college. Most often yoga training camps and

workshops are also organised for staff and students.

New Infrastructure: The college administration has continually expanded its infrastructure both physical and digital. A-block of the college has been expanded with the construction of five new rooms with IT facilities like LED Interactive panels with the Wi-Fi connection.

offers along with internet facility, Reference service, Previous Question Papers, Information deployment and notification, and other required study materials, Newspaper Clipping etc.

The college library is partially computerized and automated using KOHA software since 2015. A dedicated Library Committee, comprised of eight esteemed members, diligently oversees matters pertaining to book acquisitions, periodical subscriptions, and the continual improvement of library services. Furthermore, our affiliation with other college libraries through the Interlibrary Loan program, facilitated by the Developing Library Network (DELNET) expands our access to a vast array of electronic resources. From e-books and e-journals to thesis, dissertations, and articles the library serves as a gateway to a wealth of digital knowledge. Subscription to the N-LIST database at the library for faculty and student access to a wide range of e-journals and e-books.

In 2018-19, the college received a RUSA 2.0 grant for its development initiatives. Annual meetings of the Governing Body are held, along with recurring meetings of the Advisory Committee, RUSA committee, and IQAC, where decisions are made regarding infrastructural development, extracurricular activities, sports, cultural events, academic enhancements, e-Governance, and strategies for the upcoming academic years. The strategic plans of the college are outlined in a document attached

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for reference.

The implementation of rules, policies, and procedures is effectively managed by the Administrative Unit of the College. Financial matters are overseen by the Accounts Department, where the accountant, in consultation with the Bursar, reviews and presents financial documents to the principal for approval. Purchases are made based on recommendations from the Purchase Committee.

To ensure that students and faculty meet international standards, the college actively organizes National Conferences, Seminars, Faculty Development Programs (FDPs), and Workshops. Additionally, the college offers various certificate courses in diverse domains to enhance the skills of its students.

At the administrative level, the principal leads the institute, overseeing both academic and administrative processes. Staff members, including department heads, provide suggestions to the principal on academic matters, with responsibilities delegated to department heads and coordinators of various cells and committees. Decisions and policies related to students, academics, and co-curricular activities are collaboratively discussed and promptly implemented for the students' benefit. The IQAC works towards improving academic and administrative performance and institutionalizing best practices.

The college strictly adheres to the service rules outlined in the University calendar of Maharshi Dayanand University and the Directorate General of Higher Education, Government of Haryana for appointment and service-related procedures, such as leaves, salary increments, and promotions. Well-defined procedures are followed for appointments, including merit preparation and interview processes. Promotion of faculty members is based on UGC scores for Academic Performance Indicators (APIs) in the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS).

The college ensures optimal allocation and utilization of financial resources through various committees responsible for different aspects, such as the RUSA committee, Library Committee, and sports committee. The IQAC recognizes the need for adequate infrastructure, well-equipped library and labs, increased ICT usage, development of e-learning resources, and promotion of student and faculty research culture in response to growing student enrollment. An effective and transparent continuous evaluation system is in place, along with Mentor-Mentee groups to support student development.

The performance appraisal system in any organization is a crucial tool that provides valuable information for evaluating employees' skills, knowledge, competencies, abilities, and overall job performance. In our college, there is a well-established mechanism for evaluating both teaching and non-teaching staff members. Faculty members are required to complete an Annual Confidential Report(ACR) which includes university results, teaching methods, and contributions to college events, which is then approved by the College principal and management.

Non-teaching staff members are also assessed through the ACR, with the principal being the competent authority for evaluating duties performed, timeliness, teamwork, and integrity.

Teaching staff follow the Career Advancement scheme (CAS) issued by the UGC for promotions. They must submit a Self-Performance Appraisal form with Academic Performance Indicators (API) to the IQAC for promotion consideration. The IQAC reviews the records based on criteria such as academics, administration, skill development, and professional enhancement, and recommends cases to the College Governing Body. The screening committee, appointed by the University, verifies API scores and

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recommends cases for promotion. Final approval is then granted by the Director General of Higher Education in Haryana.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1

Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

The college has a well defined mechanism for effective and efficient use of financial resources. In the annual budget, long term planning is taken into consideration in order to fulfill the promises made by the college as per its vision and mission statement. Before the commencement of each financial year, heads of the department and coordinator submit a proposal on budget to the Principal. The Principal with the help of IQAC monitors the proposal and send it to management for sanction. All the purchases are done following due procedure like tender, quotations etc by the respective purchase/tender committees. The college Bursar verifies all the expenses by cross checking from necessary vouchers. Proper stock entries are maintained in the stock registers and routine stock verification is performed on regular intervals. The college recognizes the importance of transparency and accountability in financial management and conducts internal and external financial audits regularly to ensure compliance with regulations and to follow best practices of the optimum utilization of the available resources. The external Audit is conducted by an external agency (Chartered Accountant) engaged by the college whereas internal audit committee meant to check on every financial decision. The internal audit committee comprises of Head of the Institution, IQAC coordinator, Bursar and a faculty of the college. Audited Statement of accounts regarding grant from UGC, State Govt., donations, fees collected from

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students etc are well maintained year wise along with audited cash books and stock registers for records. For receipt of funds from the UGC/State Govt. amount received and amount utilized are submitted to them in the form of utilization certificates duly signed by the head of the College. In the internal Audit all vouchers/account statements for the expenses incurred under different heads are thoroughly checked by Internal Audit committee through verifying bills and vouchers to assess the effectiveness and efficiency of financial processes and controls. Externally, the Chartered accountant audits the accounts to verify financial statements and ensure adherence to legal and regulatory requirements. The Auditor ensures that all payments are duly authorized and approved by the competent authority. In the event of audit objections, a mechanism is in place to address and settle these issues promptly. This mechanism involves a thorough review of audit findings, identification of root causes, and development of action plans to address any deficiencies. The institution works closely with auditors, management, and stakeholders to resolve audit objections in a timely manner, ensuring that corrective actions are implemented effectively to strengthen financial controls and improve overall financial management practices. All major financial transactions are done through bank via Cheque/RTGS etc for increased transparency. These mechanisms exhibit the adherence to financial discipline to avoid defalcation of funds or properties of the college at all levels.
