• College budget includes recurring expenses, such as teaching and non-teaching Staffs' salary, lighting and electrification, postage and tele-communication, internet charge, maintenance cost, printing & stationery, other consumable charges, etc., and non-recurring expenses like purchase of books & journals, IT and lab equipment, furniture, and other infra-structural development expenses.

• The Bills submitted of various expenses are verified by the Bursar.

• Finally, internal audit committee submits their report on the reliability of statement of Accounts.

Awareness campaigns and workshops are conducted regularly to educate staff and students about waste segregation and sustainable practices. The institution also prioritizes green practices, using compost pits to manage dried leaves and plant clippings from the tree-lined campus.

E-waste generated within the campus is centrally stored and responsibly disposed of through authorized vendors. The institution encourages repair and reuse of electronic devices wherever feasible to extend their lifespan. Obsolete electronic items, such as monitors, keyboards, and printers, are carefully segregated and sold as scrap to ensure eco-friendly disposal, thereby preventing harm to the environment.
